That is, we will provide public, free, and unrestricted online access and the data will be accessible outside of Canada. In this case, your de-identified data could also be shared with researchers who are not subject to the TCPS2 -The Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans - a joint policy of Canada's three federal research agencies – the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR), the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC), and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC).
3. Your identity (i.e. your name or any other information that could identify you) as a participant in this project will be kept confidential. In other words, it will not be included in de-identified data.
